SCOPE

This guide is intended to assist in locating materials and information about Frederick Douglass in the Rochester Central Public Library. INTRODUCTION

Born a slave in 1818, Frederick Douglass escaped and later purchased his freedom, becoming an orator for the abolitionist movement, an author, editor, and U.S. Marshall who contributed to the reformation of America until his death on February 20, 1895. Douglass moved to Rochester in 1847 and began publishing the abolitionist newspaper *The North Star* that same year from an office on Main Street. When a fire suspected to be arson destroyed his home in 1872, Douglass and his family left Rochester and made a new home in Washington, D.C. Douglass died in 1895 and is buried in Mount Hope Cemetery.
