SCOPE

INTRODUCTION

Born in Rochester in 1865, Kate Gleason (born Catherine Anselm Gleason) became the first woman to attend the Sibley College of Engineering at Cornell University in 1884. Her father owned a machine tool company that would later be known as Gleason Works, which was known for being one of the most important manufacturers of gear-cutting machine tools in the world. When Kate was 12, she asked for and received permission to work in her father's factory. Two years later, Kate became responsible for keeping the company's books. Kate spent many productive years developing Gleason Works' business, helping it to become one of the first American manufacturers to globalize international sales. In 1914, she was the first woman elected to full membership in the American Society of Mechanical Engineers. In 1917, after leaving Gleason Works, Kate became president of the First National Bank of East Rochester, a community that also saw her efforts to create affordable housing for working class families. These structures still stand today. In acknowledgement of her achievements, the Rochester Institute of Technology named its engineering college The Kate Gleason College of Engineering after this inspirational woman.
